CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The ACM Special Interest Group on Management of Data (SIGMOD) wants undergraduate students who have an interest in database systems to experience the cutting edge research presented at the ACM SIGMOD/PODS Joint Confs. (Intl. Conf. on Management of Data and Symposium on Principles of Database Systems). In order to help those undergraduate students attend the conference, hence encouraging them to pursue a career related to database research, a scholarship program was introduced by SIGMOD in 2000 and successfully continued in the following years. It is worthwhile noting that the program has been of a truly international nature.

Each scholarship provides up to US\$1,000 to defray conference attendance costs (e.g., travel and lodging) plus Conference registration. Awardees will be responsible for their own travel arrangements, including health insurance and visa applications if

necessary. Selected students will be recognized at the ACM SIGMOD 2006 awards sessions.

All undergraduate students who have completed or are enrolled in a database course by the application deadline are eligible for the scholarship. Note that, for the purpose of this award, a student is considered an undergraduate student if he/she has not yet obtained a BS (or equivalent) degree or has obtained that degree on or after Dec/2005, and he/she is not enrolled in a graduate program at the time of the application. If the applicant's school system is "non-traditional", and the applicant consider him/herself eligible then the committee should be contacted before the application is submitted. All application materials must be received no later than May 9, 2006. Decisions will be sent to the applicants by May 18, 2006.
